



Overview:

Project Sight Express is an innovative, mobile eye care initiative aimed at delivering doorstep vision diagnostics and care to underserved communities across India. It aligns with the **Digital Health Mission** of the Hon'ble Prime Minister and embodies a transformative vision to make quality eye care universally accessible.

Key Objectives:

- Address preventable blindness through early diagnosis
- Provide doorstep eye screenings using AI and portable diagnostic tools
- Enable referrals and teleconsultations for complex cases
- Support schools and communities with targeted eye health interventions
- Empower marginalized populations with restored vision and dignity

Core Services Offered:

- Visual acuity checks
- Al-based screenings (glaucoma, diabetic retinopathy)
- Portable fundus and slit-lamp exams
- On-the-spot lens prescriptions
- Intraocular pressure measurement
- Teleconsultation and triage support

Target Impact Areas:

- School Health: Early detection of vision problems in children
- Community Camps: Screening for cataracts and age-related conditions
- Data Collection: Regional eye health mapping for public health strategy

Capital Requirement:

To launch the mobile unit, a total of **INR 23.449 Lakhs (~USD 27,445)** is needed.

- Mobile Van (INR 6.5 L)
- Remidio Diagnostic Devices (INR ~9.24 L)
- Al Platform Subscription (INR 1.83 L)
- Portable Tonometer (INR 3.92 L)
- Slit Lamp Imaging Module (INR 1.96 L)

Digital health is national need

A convocation ceremony for the 2nd and 3rd batch of trainees of the Digital Health Assistant (DHA) programme was held on December 17 at the Delhi Commonwealth Women's Association (DCWA) medical facility training centre by the Society for Administration of Telemedicine and Healthcare Informatics (SATHI).

The induction of 4th batch of students also took place at the event.

The programme, sponsored by Ion Foundation, was a groundbreaking effort that bridged the healthcare workforce gap with Al-ready students.

As there is a lack of IT proficiency among medical professionals, the DHA programme provides a cost-effective and time-efficient path to a rewarding career in healthcare for school pass- outs.

It provides strong data management skills for AI applications, proficiency in tele-health and other digital healthcare tools along with deep understanding of patient care and support.

SATHI patron Padmashri Sneh Bhargava underscored the urgent need for reforms in the India's healthcare system, a legacy of the British era that prioritised western medicine over AYUSH practices. This imbalance, coupled with a severe shortage of healthcare workers, has resulted in limited access to quality care for a significant portion of the population, she said.

There is a stark disparity between doctors and low-level care providers

hindering effective healthcare delivery at the grassroots level. SATHI aims to rectify this by significantly moving towards a more balanced ratio of seven jurior level workers to one doctor.

Furthermore, the initiative recognises the valuable contributions of AY-USH systems like Ayurveda, Yoga, and Naturopathy. By integrating these traditional practices into the mainstream healthcare system, SATHI aims to provide a more holistic and comprehensive approach to healthcare.

"Digital health is a national need. Our programme offers a practical solution to a national issue," said Dr Shashi Gogia. President of SATHI.



NEW DELHI: Encouraged by the success of its pilot programme for training therapists and doctors in the treatment of lymphedema or lym-phatic filariasi(also called elephantiasis/ hathipao in Hindi), the Society for Administra-tion of Telemedicine and Healthcare Inforand Healthcare Infor-matics (SATHI)plans to conduct more such programmes with a view to creating several lymphedema care cen-tres across the country.
